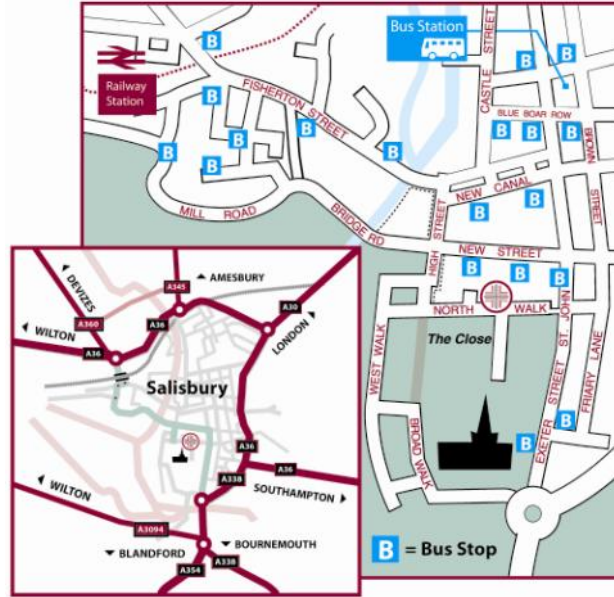
Sarum College has an equal opportunities policy and welcomes students and visitors with disabilities. Please discuss any special requirements with a member of our Hospitality staff.

Arrival by bus or train

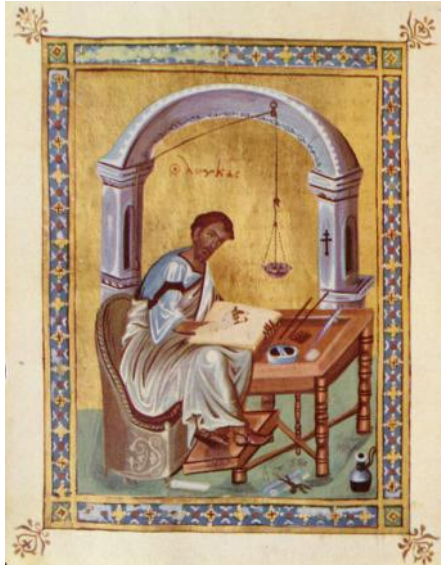

Pastoral Liturgy Programme

The Pastoral Liturgy programme at Sarum College is designed to provide ordained and lay ministers and their congregations opportunities to learn more about different aspects of Christian Worship in order to promote liturgical renewal.

Experienced and knowledgeable speakers will help participants gain practical liturgical skills and develop their theological understanding of Christian worship.



Preaching on Luke in Lent
22 January
10am to 4pm
Sarum College

This day will help preachers make sense of the lectionary provision for Lent in the year of Luke in the Revised Common Lectionary. Sessions will look at the choice of passages and their relationship to the designated readings from the Old Testament and Epistle. The focus on Lent will enable participants to explore the Lectionary provision in light of the liturgical season.

This day is for all those with a preaching ministry, lay and ordained.

Thomas O'Loughlin is professor of Historical Theology at the University of Nottingham and noted preacher. He has written *Liturgical Resources for Luke's Year: Sundays in Ordinary Time in Year C* (Columba Press, 2006) and *Liturgical Resources For Lent & Eastertide: Year A* (Columba Press, 2005).

Praying with the Bereaved
20 March, 10am to 4pm

A day to explore and experience some of the many ways adults and children dealing with loss and bereavement can be supported through prayer, ritual and symbol.

This day is especially suitable for all those with pastoral care of the bereaved: clergy, lay pastoral workers, bereavement counsellors.

This is a Wellsprings workshop run by Catherine McElhinney and Kathryn Turner, who have worked extensively in prayer and liturgy drawing on Christian tradition in new and creative ways.

Icon Workshop
12 June, 12.15 to 5.30pm
Sarum College

Many individuals and churches have icons and use them in prayer. This day will explore the composition of key icons, the theological interpretation of them and their use in both public and private worship. There will be a celebration of the Divine Liturgy of the Orthodox Church in the College Chapel at 10.30am for those who wish to attend. The workshop will begin after the liturgy at 12.15.

Dr Andreas Andreopoulos is Director of the Centre for Orthodox Studies at the University of Wales Lampeter and has written extensively on the interpretation and use of icons. His major publications in this field are *Art as Theology: from the Postmodern to the Medieval* (Equinox Publishing, 2007) and *Metamorphosis: The Transfiguration in Byzantine Theology and Iconography* (SVS Press, 2005).

Liturgies of Remembrance
15 September, 10am to 4pm
Sarum College

The day will begin with an exploration of the origins, theology and contemporary liturgical provision for Remembrance and then discuss their use in parish, civic and school contexts.

Participants will be introduced to new liturgical resources, to ritual and ceremonial involving both the church and members of the armed forces, and to occasions where there may be multi-faith issues.

The Revd Jonathan Ball is Senior Chaplain to the Bishop of Salisbury. He served as an Army chaplain between 1996 and 2008, with operational service in Northern Ireland, Congo, Kosovo, Iraq and Afghanistan. His last posting was as Staff Chaplain to the Chaplain-General at Ministry of Defence Chaplains (Army) during which time he collaborated on the 2008 Tri-service Armed Forces Operational Service Book.

Preaching on Matthew in Advent
5 November, 10am to 4pm
Sarum College

The four sessions in this day will explore the use of **Matthew's Gospel in Year A of the Revised Common Lectionary**. The distinctive nature of Matthew's Gospel will be discussed and key features of the choice of Old Testament and Epistles to accompany the Gospel throughout the year followed by a focus on the lectionary and liturgical provision for Advent.
